Species Available

Please Note: species availability is subject to change without notice and are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Tree species:

- Atlantic white cedar
- Bald cypress
- Black gum
- Black walnut
- Buttonbush
- Chickasaw plum
- southern crabapple
- crape myrtle
- eastern red cedar
- flowering dogwood
- longleaf pine
- persimmon
- overcup oak
- river birch
- wax myrtle and coastal white oak

Grass species:

- Indian grass
- Little bluestem
- Wiregrass

TreeFest Tips

- There is a limit of 5 trees and/or grasses per household.
- The trees and grasses will live a very long life and pre-planning at home will help save time down the road. Consider the size of your site, whether utility lines exist above and below ground, proximity to buildings and site conditions such as soil type, drainage or sun exposure. There will be experts on hand to help you decide which tree or grass will work best for your site, as well as how to take care of them.
- Seedlings will be wrapped in wet newspaper that may be reused or planted with your tree, then placed in a plastic bag for transporting.
- Please consider bringing a plastic grocery bag or reusable bag to reduce the number of new plastic bags used.
- The seedlings should be kept moist and planted as soon as possible; ideally the same weekend as TreeFest.
- TreeFest is funded by the donations received from participants during the event, and there is a suggested donation of \$3 per household.
